Branding Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This group will now be referred to as the “New Hampshire Perinatal Substance Exposure Collaborative” formerly the Perinatal Substance Exposure Task Force.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ The work of this group is no longer formally tied to the NH Governor’s Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs</li></ul></li><li>• JSI has worked to produce new branding materials.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ A survey was sent to all Collaborative members in mid-November to collect feedback on logo and color palette options</li><li>◦ A logo and color palette were created based on survey responses</li><li>◦ JSI has also created other new branding materials such as a branding guide and agenda and powerpoint templates</li><li>◦ Older documents developed under the Governor’s Commission will not be updated with the new branding</li></ul></li><li>• A new webpage for the Collaborative can be found <a href="#">here</a><ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>◦ The new webpage contains the same information but is now updated with the new branding</li></ul></li></ul>

POSC Advisory Group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● JSI will be creating three short, foundational videos to explain POSC in NH<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Two videos will be provider-facing, and one will be family-facing</li></ul></li><li>● JSI will coordinate 4 input sessions (likely virtual) with families to gain input on the development of these videos<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Recognizing that trust is important, JSI is planning to engage with someone who is already working with communities and could help recruit and facilitate the input sessions</li></ul></li><li>● Recruitment/co-facilitator suggestions received from the collaborative<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ DCYF Parent Partner Program</li><li>○ Holly Gaspar shared that she created a similar structure for FRC awareness (a target population of parents/caregivers and providers)</li><li>○ Cheri Bryer</li><li>○ Strength to Succeed Program</li></ul></li><li>● JSI plans to use this Collaborative as the advisory group for the provider-facing videos.</li><li>● What POSC information would you like to see highlighted in the provider-facing videos? Any commonly-asked questions from providers or points that should be clearly articulated?</li></ul>	-JSI will follow up with those who provided suggestions for the POSC advisory group and videos.



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Common questions from providers: What does a POSC have to do with reporting? What does it have to do with notice? What is the POSC? Who completes the POSC? When do we complete the POSC? Who owns the POSC? Where does the POSC go after delivery?</li><li>○ Important to communicate the legislative obligation of POSC</li><li>● Timeline<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Videos will be completed by the fall</li><li>○ Planning to have facilitated at least one input session and completed the script for one provider video by the March Collaborative meeting</li></ul></li></ul>

Participant Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Doulas and Perinatal Community Health Workers in Medicaid Learning Series - shared by Hannah Lessels<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ This is a webinar series hosted by the Institute for Medicaid Innovation. The first session was on December 1, 2022.</li><li>○ The learning series focuses on the work of community-based doulas and how they can support perinatal patients.</li><li>○ There is an emphasis on the evidence base for community-based doula involvement and the evidence for why they are a good investment for MCO coverage.</li><li>○ The Institute for Medicaid Innovation will share names of participants by state following the completion of the webinar series.</li></ul></li></ul>	JSI will share registration information via the Perinatal Update email.
