### **Technical Assistance for NH MS YRBS Services**

The Center has developed an electronic Middle School Youth Risk Behavior Survey (MS YRBS), based on the 2025 CDC MS YRBS Survey, for use by NH middle schools to survey students in grades six through eight. Many middle schools in NH have participated in the MS YRBS in order to inform community-based health initiatives. The survey meets the Drug-Free Community (DFC) grantee reporting requirements. Given an increased interest from communities to understand the behaviors and perceptions of middle school youth, the Center has integrated these services into their technical assistance request process. #### Ozempic Linked to Lower Opioid Overdose and Alcohol Use Disorder Rates

In <u>a recent study</u>, those who have opioid or alcohol use disorder who take Ozempic or similar medications for other chronic medical conditions are showing a 40% lower rate of opioid overdose and 50% lower rate of alcohol intoxication compared to those who do not use these medications.
