Updates from The Partnership

Registration is open for the <u>September 2025 Partnership</u> <u>Convening</u> on September 5th. The event theme is "Building Bridges in Prevention to Support Youth Across the Continuum of Care", stressing the importance of early prevention planning and



tailored interventions. Attendees will learn strategies to promote substance non-use among youth and young adults, reduce stigma in their communities, and encourage help-seeking behaviors.



Treating Addiction in Jails and Prisons ECHO

JSI Research & Training Institute, Inc. is recruiting for their <u>Treating Addiction in Jails and Prisons ECHO</u>. This is a team-based opportunity where each participating jail or prison can assemble a team of 2-5 staff members. Teams will engage in nine one-hour monthly sessions, commencing in January 2026. Participants will have the opportunity to share their knowledge and expertise to problem-solve complex challenges, ultimately supporting the delivery of best practice care for individuals experiencing incarceration. New Hampshire Student Assistance Network

The New Hampshire Student Assistance Network seeks to develop, align, and promote the NH Student Assistance Programs (NH SAP) based on the nationally recognized, evidence-based Project SUCCESS. In collaboration with the NH Bureau of Drug and Alcohol Services, The Network continues to support SAPs by providing funding, group and individual technical assistance, as well as support with evaluation and sustainability planning.

The Network supports SAP Coordinators who engage in school-wide awareness activities, implement prevention education curricula, lead individual and group counseling with students, and engage with parents to help them support their children.

The project is excited to enter the upcoming school year with close to 40 SAP Coordinators from across the state. The new academic calendar will welcome these coordinators and partners from the state to an in-person kick-off meeting to work, encourage engagement with fellow coordinators, participate in hands-on activities around student confidentiality practices, as well as learn about new policy trends at the state level.



Turn on the Lights Podcast

INTO LIGHT Project NH exhibition – Drug Addiction: Real People, Real Stories

This <u>exhibition</u>, hosted at Plymouth State University, features original portraits and stories of people in New Hampshire who have died from drug use or related causes. The goal of the exhibition is to provide education and reduce stigma surrounding substance use disorder. The exhibition is free and is open starting August 25, 2025 through November 8, 2025.
